Created by musician and award-winning book author **Gabriel Guzmán**, **De un fandango** is an educational project designed for students **K-12** that takes them on a journey through the diversity of Mexico's music and culture.

Students will learn in a fun way traditional Mexican games, and songs, based on De un fandango; a collection of traditional music compiled by Gabriel Guzmán and which received an **Honorable Mention** for **Best School Textbook** by the **National Institute of Anthropology and History**, in Mexico City.

Activities in a typical one-hour school assembly include:

- Storytelling
- Chants, songs, and rhymes in Spanish
- Clapping games
- Games with movement, music, and singing
- Introduction to son jarocho instruments; jarana, marimbol, tambourine
- Introduction to the fandango jarocho with zapateado dancing on the tarima
- Traditional lottery, jarocha lottery
